

Proposed Amendments to the ASLH By-Laws
November 12, 2009

On November 12, 2009, the Board of Directors voted unanimously to approve the following amendments to the ASLH By-Laws. The reason for the amendment is that the Cambridge University Press, which is now publishing the *Law and History Review*, will handle subscriptions to the *Review* for individual members of the Society as part of our regular dues-collection process, but it wants to deal with institutional members separately. This page constitutes notice to the membership under Article 5, section 8 of the by-laws, as of November 17, 2009. Under that by-law these amendments will stand approved unless within thirty days of this date ten or more members of the Society petition the president to submit the amendments to the membership for their approval.

Article 1, section 1

Upon application and payment of annual dues any individual ~~or institution~~ interested in legal history may be a member.

Article 1, section 2

A member is entitled to receive all publications as provided by the directors and officers and to attend any general meetings. An individual member, but not an institutional ~~subscriber member~~, is also entitled to vote for the election of directors and officers and for other purposes herein provided, and to serve in any elected or appointed capacity.
